

The stamps feature colourful composite images charting the origins and evolution of modern meteorology, celebrating pioneers, innovations and milestone moments. You'll also discover a fact-filled Presentation Pack, framed artwork and other souvenirs.

For most of human history, weather was regarded as a mysterious force of nature. Today, thanks to a group of 19th-century cloud-naming trailblazers, and advances in science and technology, we have the world's weather at our fingertips with the tap of an app.


