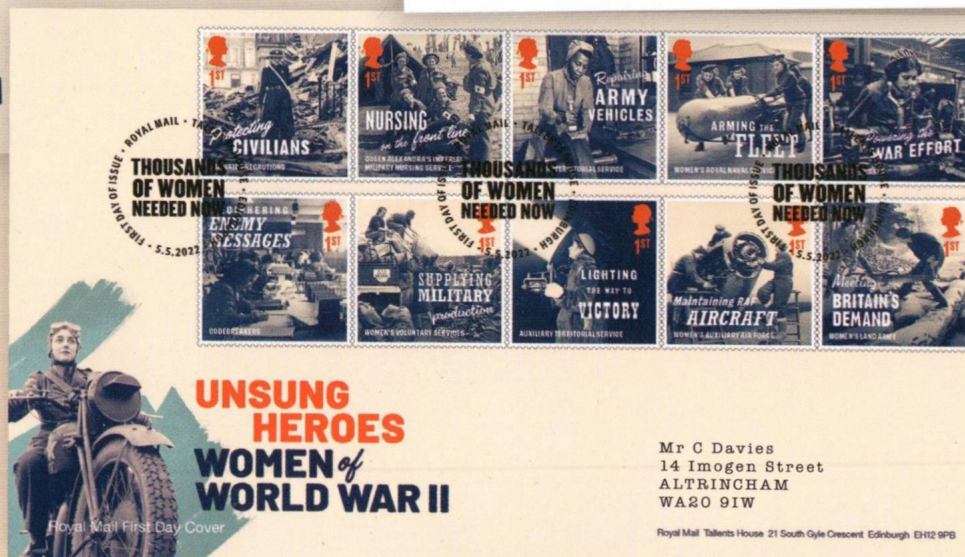

Honouring the vital roles undertaken by women in wartime

World War II changed the lives of women around the world. The conflict involved women as never before; not just as victims, but also as active participants. In Britain, they were conscripted into key roles in the military, agriculture and industry. Others joined voluntary organisations, served in civil defence, cared for evacuees and refugees, or supported the war effort at home.

This issue of stamps and souvenirs salutes the nearly seven million women who made a vital contribution to the war effort and the Allied victory. Explore collectibles featuring powerful stories and evocative images – including rare and iconic photographs. You'll discover a Miniature Sheet celebrating the pioneering 'Spitfire Women' of the Air Transport Auxiliary and a Prestige Stamp Book pane of barcoded definitive stamps – a Royal Mail first.

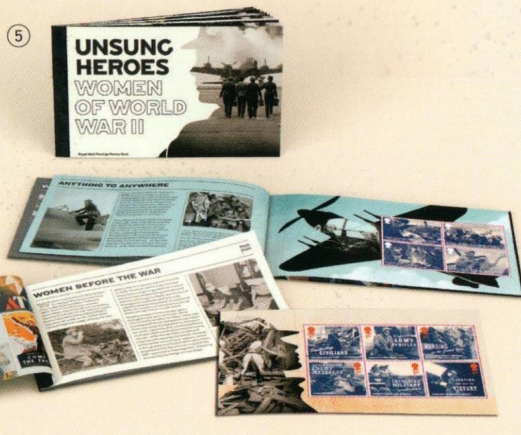

- Historian Professor Lucy Noakes explores topics including female conscription, women in the military and industry across the Empire, the Ferry Pilots, the front line and Home Front.
- The book is filled with insights and imagery, including photographs of women in action in their wartime roles.
- It contains all 14 Unsung Heroes stamps perforated as 'panes' within the book – plus an extra pane of barcoded definitive stamps unique to this issue*.
- This Prestige Stamp Book is printed litho and gummed, apart from the mixed definitive pane, which is printed gravure, self-adhesive.

*This Prestige Stamp Book is a slightly larger size to accommodate this barcoded pane – it will be 4mm bigger in height (96mm increased to 100mm). A larger leaf for the PSB album is available for purchase.

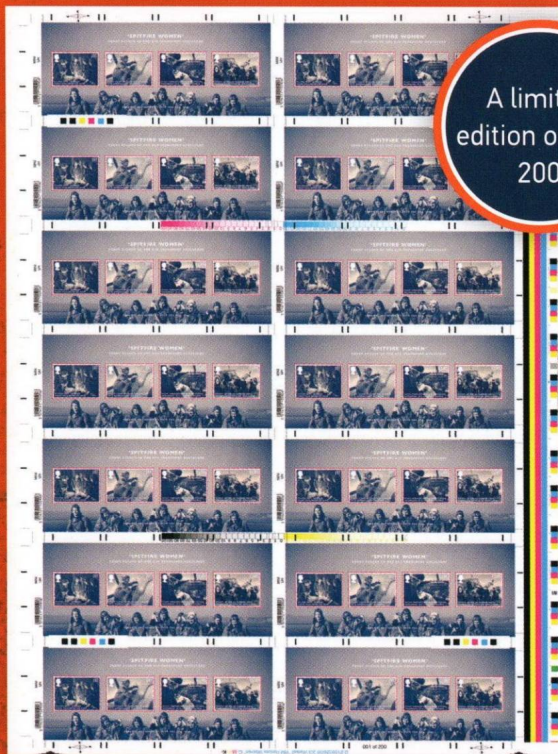
