## Europa – Art in the 20th Century





11 May 1993

Four stamps under the Europa title will be issued on 11 May, all depict major works of 20th century British art.

Britain's artists have made a unique contribution to the modern art movement, and their achievement is recognised in this set of stamps. It is Royal Mail's contribution to "Art in the Twentieth Century", which has been adopted by Europe's postal administrations as the theme to be celebrated in 1993. The images presented – from a sculptor, a printmaker, and iconographer and an abstract painter – are symbolic of the enormous and exceptionally varied talent that has been fostered in the past ten decades among the artists of the United Kingdom.

The values cover the inland 1st class and EC basic rates (24p), Europe, non-EC basic rate (28p), Worldwide postcard rate (33p), and basic

airmail letter rate (39p).



The **24p** stamp features the "Family Group" by sculptor Henry Moore, a 152cm high bronze created in 1948-9. It is now at the Henry Moore Foundation, Much Hadham, Herts.

The **28p** value depicts a detail from Edward Bawden's "Kew Gardens" – a lithograph after a linocut, 101 x 63cm, dating from 1936. It is now at the Cecil Huggins Art Gallery, Bedford.

The **33p** denomination shows Sir Stanley Spencer's painting "St Francis and the Birds" – an oil on canvas, 71 x 61cm, produced in 1953 and now in the Tate Gallery, London.

The final value, **39p** features Ben Nicholson's "Still Life Odyssey 1", dating from 1947. This oil on canvas, 69 x 56cm, is reproduced on the stamp courtesy of the British Council, London.

This issue marks the first appearance of the new Europa symbol on a set of Royal Mail special stamps. As a logotype, it takes the place of the familiar CEPT symbol that had been used for a number of years by the Conference of European Posts and Telecommunications Administrations.

The stamp has been designed by Ashted Dastor, FCSD, FSTD, who also designed the presentation pack.



First Day Facilities

Unstamped Royal Mail first day cover envelopes will be available from main post offices, the Bureau, Collections, and philatelic counters around a week before 11 May, price 21p.

The Bureau will provide a first day cover service – collectors may order the Royal Mail cover bearing the stamps cancelled with a pictorial "First Day of Issue" postmark of the

First Day Posting Boxes will be provided at most main post offices for collectors who wish to post covers to receive the standard, nonpictorial "First Day of Issue" handstamps.

Details of other special handstamps, sponsored by Royal Mail, stamp dealers and others, will be found in the *British Postmark Bulletin* – the Royal Mail's magazine for postmark collectors. It is available on subscription from the British Philatelic Bureau: £10 UK and Europe, £21.75 Rest of World (Airmail).

There will be no souvenir covers; these have now been discontinued.



## Marine Timekeepers Stamps

The four stamps issued on 16 February to commemorate John Harrison have generated considerable interest amongst particularly for the reproduction of the intricate detail of the mechanisms of Harrison's timekeepers. Readers will be interested to know that these illustrations are the work of David Penny, FBHI, FSAI. Mr Penny was born in 1949 and graduated in illustration from Hornsey College of Art in 1970. After working in publishing for a short while, he became a freelance illustrator and has worked for the British Museum, Sunday Times Magazine, the National Maritime Museum, and many overseas clients.

He is a part-time lecturer at the Royal College of Art, past Chairman of the Association of Illustrators, Honorary Fellow of the British Horological Institute and Fellow of the Society of Architectural & Industrial Illustrators. From 1986 to 1992 he was Editor of *Antiquarian Horology*, and has written in many magazines.

Mr Penny's illustrations were used as the main features of the stamp designs by Howard Brown, who has previously designed the 1991 Map issue.
