1A silver • 1B pale turquoisegreen • 1C black • 1D greyblack (deep grey 2nd class) • Phosphor P10 2nd class, P11 others FIVE STAMPS to mark the 50th anniversary of the accession of HM The Queen will go on sale at post offices, Royal Mail Tallents House and Post Office philatelic outlets on 6 February. The stamps, designed by Kate Stephens, feature studies of The Queen by the following photographers or photographic studies: 2nd class – official portrait by Dorothy Wilding (1952); 1st class – official portrait by Cecil Beaton (1968); E (European rate, 37p) – portrait by Lord Snowdon taken at Windsor Castle (1978); 45p – portrait by Yousef Karsh of Ottawa (1984); and 65p – portrait by Tim Graham taken at banquet at Prague Castle during visit to Czech Republic (1996). The stamps will be included in a prestige book (see p146) as well as in normal counter sheets.

Designs were submitted to the Stamp Advisory Committee, including contributions from Jeffery Matthews. The Committee selected the photographic-based work of Kate Stephens, which uses classic formal and informal portraits from the five decades of her reign. Each image has been cropped so that all are connected by eye-line.

FIRST DAY FACILITIES Unstamped Royal Mail FDG envelopes will be available from main post offices and philatelic outlets about a week before 6 February, price 25p. Orders for FDGs with the stamps cancelled by a pictorial first day postmark of Tallents House or Windsor must reach Tallents House by the day of issue. Price £2.69 UK (including VAT) or £2.29 overseas (no VAT).

Collectors may send stamped covers on the day of issue to: Royal Mail Tallents House, 21 South Gyle Crescent, Edinburgh EH12 9PB, or Special Handstamp Centre, Royal Mail, Wexham Road, Slough SLI IAA (Windsor postmark), marking the outer envelope 'fd0205' (Tallents House), or 'fd0206' (Windsor). Covers can be posted or handed in at main post offices for the Windsor postmark. A non-pictorial Windsor postmark is also available from the Special Handstamp Centre, request 'fd0206 fd'.

Details of sponsored handstamps for 6 February will be announced in the *British Postmark Bulletin* – available on subscription from Tallents House (£10 uk/Europe; £21.75 elsewhere).
