Animal Tales Royal Mail joins the US Postal



The 68p Caterpillar stamp has two punctures (at bottom left and top right), referring to the similar holes in the pages of The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

THE FIRST SPECIAL ISSUE of 2006 goes on sale at Post Office branches, Tallents House and Post Office philatelic outlets on 10 January. Printed in se-tenant pairs, the stamps depict characters from British and American children's books. The set is a joint issue with the US Postal Service. The designs are: 2nd class The Tale of Jeremy Fisher by Beatrix Potter and Kipper by Mick Inkpen; 1st class The Enormous Crocodile by Roald Dahl and More About Paddington by Michael Bond; 42p Comic Adventures of Boots by Satoshi Kitamura and Alice's Adventures in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll; 68p The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle and Maisy's ABC by Lucy Cousins. The stamps were designed by Rose Design.

Post office branches will be supplied with sheets of 30; sheets of 60, with gutter margin, will be supplied to Royal Mail Tallents House and Post Office philatelic outlets.



Children's literature Royal Mail has issued several sets relating to children's literature: 1979 International Year of the Child; 1988 Edward Lear; 1997 Enid Blyton; 1998 Magical Worlds; 2002 Just So Stories and Peter Pan; also 1990 'Smiles', 1993 'Gift Giving' and 1994 'Messages' greetings stamps.

Characters from Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland and Alice Through the Looking Glass featured on the 13p stamp in the 1979 set, two of the 1990 (Cheshire Cat, Queen of Hearts), one of the 1993 (Tweedledum & Tweedledee), and one of the 1994 greetings stamps (Alice), and the 63p value of the 1998 issue. Paddington Bear featured on one of the 1994 greetings stamps. Whilst the new 2nd class is the first stamp featuring Jeremy Fisher, other Beatrix Potter characters featured on 1979 and 1993 stamps and in The Story of Beatrix Potter prestige book of 1993 •
