

2009-2010 Definitives with iridescent print

On 17 February 2009 Royal Mail introduced a new style of definitive stamp which featured an iridescent pattern printed over the Queen's head and background (see February 2009 *Bulletin*, page 169). At that time, only Source Codes were required to identify the format the stamp originated from. Subsequently Date Codes were added to the iridescent print.

As interest in these codes has grown, and *Bulletin* readers have requested checklist of all the different combinations used in 2009 and 2010. Please note, 2009 definitives do not have a date code. The printers' names in the lists below are abbreviated as follows: DLR stands for De La Rue and WSP for Walsall Security Printers ●
